WARREN'S Washington Internet Daily

More than 35 vendors sent a letter to FTC comrs. and the Dir. of the National Institute of Standards & Technology promising to "work together to step up the anti-spam, anti-phishing efforts" undertaken by the FTC at this week's Authentication Summit (see separate story, this issue). The vendors, including Cisco, Amazon, eBay, EarthLink, Skylist, TrustE and Microsoft, suggested collaboration on Microsoft's new SenderID authentication system. Several panelists on Tues., such as Apache's Dan Quinlan, expressed concerns over Sender ID's proprietary nature (WID Nov 10 p4). Meanwhile, Web software developer BuyerLeverage praised the FTC for its efforts to fight spam, but called the efforts "only a preliminary step." BuyerLeverage suggested a "deposit based economic solution" as the next step in combating spam and other e-mail based fraud.
